Call for Applications

Society is changing rapidly which not only has implications on the public role of museums but also in the way we experience and see museums as part of our cultural framework. Museums have to adapt to stay relevant and need exceptional leaders who can share their commitment and inspire staff as well as stakeholders and drive forward necessary change.

In a series of sessions this programme will introduce young European museums professionals to the complex concept of self-, team- and institutional leadership helping them to explore their own competencies and leadership skills through self- reflection and group activities. International guest speakers and the leadership programme team will use the sessions to also discuss with participants the role of museums in society and use best practice models and challenging case studies as learning tools.

Who is it for?

This training programme is for young museums and cultural professionals who have either recently been appointed director (or head of a department) of a museum or a cultural institution or who are aspiring to become leaders in their institutions/sector.

Applicants should be under the age of 36 unless they have started their career late.

Other Programme Details

- 3.5 days programme in Munich
- Full-board accommodation (whole group stays together)
- Mix of experts' inputs, discussions and workshops
- Evening after-dinner talks
- Small team of international experts

Application process

Interested candidates should send

- a letter of intent (1-2 pages only) outlining why they want to participate in the programme
- a short CV (max. 3 pages)
- and briefly describe their current role and responsibilities in the organisation they work for

Deadline of submission is June, 26th

Selection process

All applications are reviewed by the leadership selection committee and a short list of 16 to 18 candidates will be announced at the end of June/beginning of July.

Programme Fee and Accommodation

Fee: 540 € plus 310 € full-board accommodation at the Kerschensteiner Kolleg

Limited spaces (16 – 18 maximum);

Travel to and from Munich needs to be arranged individually.

Funding Opportunities and Bursaries

A few ICOM National Committees, national museums associations and one national museum have announced a bursary scheme for up to 2 potential candidates.

KulturAgenda is also offering one bursary of 500 EUR to assist candidates who have problems raising the full amount of the programme fee.
